

Day 7 Little Blue Penguins (cont.)

in pairs at different jobs in the order that suits them. If your class can handle this format, it means that you can offer a more relaxed and extended work period with fewer interruptions to give instructions. Pairs of children can circulate through the activities, some of which you may have set up in particular locations around the room, without all needing to be at the same place at the same time. We find that displaying a job list similar to the one shown below, as we describe each task, helps children remember what to do and gives them a way to check themselves to be sure that they've finished everything.

Job List for Day 7

Cut string to match the height of a little blue.

Color in your height and that of the little blue on the *How Tall Is Each Penguin?* sheet.

Go to the scale and use the cans to find out how heavy a little blue feels. Fill out your *Penguin Weights* sheet.

Make your *Spin to Win* Bingo gameboard. Then cut up the cards and put them in an envelope. Store the game in your *Tavel Games Envelope*.
